## **FINANCIAL REPORT 2023/2024**

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For ease of reading, I have summarised the main changes in our financial position and the reasons, in short bullet points below that can be read alongside the financials in the income and expenditure statement:

#### Positive variances experienced during 2023/24:

- Centre rentals increased mainly due to the centre opening seven days a week
- Our overall expenditure is slightly down due to good housekeeping
- Our overall income slightly increased
- We still have a contingency fund of approx. £25,000
- Funding from NHS continues to support Pete's Chat, Veterans Best Friend, new social groups and the leadership team are planning for 2024/2025
- The Tudor Trust fund the Centre Managers for another two years, which is helping increase the hire/ groups using the centre and ensures our doors remain open.
- Fife Council warm space support allowed us to support people living in the community struggling with Food and Heating costs very much needed which we hope will be released in 2024/2025
- The centre is a Living Wage Employer to ensure our staff are our priority, but volunteers are very much needed to support the work of the centre

### Challenges and opportunities for 2024/25

- Mandy's role as CEO is to source funding which is becoming increasing harder as more charities are experiencing cost of living issues
- Grant support from heating costs appreciated as our power costs almost doubled
- Lottery Funding ceased in 2024 but groups were still funded by the People Health Trust up to Sept 2024)
- Donations/ sponsor although down from last year are still very much appreciated
- Postcode Trust/Corra supported the Happy Hoppers until the Summer of 2024, with further funding applications being worked on
